THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

PSALM 30

1 I will exalt you, O Lord, because you have lifted me up *
and have not let my enemies triumph over me.

2 O Lord my God, I cried out to you, *
and you restored me to health.

3 You brought me up, O Lord, from the dead; *
you restored my life as I was going down to the grave.

4 Sing to the Lord, you servants of God; *
give thanks for the remembrance of the holiness of God.

5 For the wrath of God endures but the twinkling of an eye, *
the divine favour for a lifetime. Weeping may spend the night, *
but joy comes in the morning.

6 While I felt secure, I said, *
"I shall never be disturbed.

7 Lord, with your favour, you made me as strong as the mountains.” *

Then you hid your face, and I was filled with fear.

I pleaded with you, saying,

THE READING

EZEK 39:21-29

Israel Restored to the Land

I will display my glory among the nations, and all the nations shall see my judgment that I have executed and my hand that I have laid on them. The house of Israel shall know that I am the Lord their God from that day forward. And the nations shall know that the house of Israel went into captivity for their iniquity, because they dealt treacherously with me. So I hid my face from them and gave them into the hand of their adversaries, and they all fell by the sword. I dealt with them according to their uncleanness and their transgressions and hid my face from them.

Therefore thus says the Lord God: Now I will restore the fortunes of Jacob and have mercy on the whole house of Israel, and I will be jealous for my holy name. They shall bear their shame, and all the treachery they have practiced against me, when they live securely in

their land with no one to make them afraid, when I have brought them back from the peoples and gathered them from their enemies' lands and through them have displayed my holiness in the sight of many nations. Then they shall know that I am the Lord their God because I sent them into exile among the nations and then gathered them into their own land. I will leave none of them behind, and I will never again hide my face from them, when I pour out my spirit upon the house of Israel, says the Lord God.
