A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

- **Visitations:** Personal visits to homes, hospitals, care facilities, or other settings to offer prayer, companionship, and support, especially for those unable to attend church in person.
- **Pastoral Care**: Providing emotional and spiritual support through listening, prayer, and guidance in times of joy, difficulty, or discernment.
- Discernment Groups: Small groups offering prayerful support and guidance for individuals seeking clarity in their faith journey, life decisions, or sense of calling whether it's to ordination, a new vocation, or other significant life choices.
